

Lynn Ann Davis. Lynn is the Head of the Preservation Department for the University of Hawai'i at Manoa. Prior to working at the University she was Chairman of the Visual and Archival Collections at Bishop Museum. As adjunct faculty member of the University's graduate programs in Library and Information Science and Museum Studies, she teaches courses in Preservation Management and Conservation Treatment. Lynn has served as a WESTPAS trainer since 2007, serving Hawai'i, American Samoa, Guam, and the Northern Marianas.

Kristen Kern. Kris is the Fine and Performing Arts Librarian at Portland State University and previously served as its Preservation/Catalog Librarian, managing the library's Preservation Unit. Since 2000 she has presented instruction on basic preservation issues at regional preservation workshops and conferences as well as teaching an online preservation course for Emporia State. Kris has been a WESTPAS trainer since 2007, serving Oregon, Idaho, and Nevada.

Gary Menges. Gary is Preservation Administrator at the University of Washington Libraries, previously Head of Special Collections at the UW Libraries for 15 years and served as Chair of the ACRL Rare Books and Manuscripts Section. He teaches the "Preservation and Conservation of Library Materials" course at the UW Information School, and is an Affiliate Faculty member in the UW Graduate Program in Museology. Gary has been a WESTPAS trainer since 2007, serving Washington and Alaska.

Barclay Ogden. Barclay is Director for Library Preservation at UC Berkeley with a primary responsibility for preservation program management and development. He has designed and implemented more than three dozen grant-funded preservation projects, including several preservation education and training projects to train mid-career librarians to become preservation administrators and to train conservation technicians in repair of circulating collections. Barclay serves as co-coordinator of the California Preservation Program and has served as the WESTPAS project co-coordinator and trainer since 2007.

Julie Page. Julie retired in 2007 from UC San Diego Libraries as Head of the Preservation Department. She co-coordinates the California Preservation Program and has been co-coordinator of WESTPAS since 2007. Her background as founder of SILDRN (San Diego/Imperial County Libraries Disaster Response Network) as well as her extensive experience with disaster preparedness and response training and response, makes her a knowledgeable resource for cultural institutions. In addition to her role as Project co-coordinator, Julie also has been a WESTPAS trainer since 2007, serving California and Colorado.

Randy Silverman. Randy is the Preservation Librarian at the University of Utah's Marriott Library since 1993, Mr. Silverman has worked in the field of book conservation since 1978. He teaches Preservation as adjunct faculty for Emporia State University, Dominican University, and University of Arizona. He consults broadly, has 80 professional publications, and has presented professional lectures or workshops in 27 U.S. states and 11 foreign countries.
